PASTOR'S POST

"Behold, I will do a new thing..."

Isaiah 43:19

As we begin 2021, it is important to turn our attention to God's Word and consider what is happening in the world around us. Thus, we will come to the Table of Our Lord for the first Sunday of the year and celebrate communion and focus us on what is most important, namely, our commitment to Jesus Christ. January 3 will also start a series that will bring us to the week prior to Lent. The series will 1) probe the Scriptures considering the "Great Reset Initiative" of the World Economic Forum; 2) consider when it is right to disobey human authorities and when it is right to fight manifestations of evil; and 3) lead us to seek God for a Great Spiritual Reset in the Church. Below are the sermon outlines for this series. Read through the Scriptures for each week and pray for the themes of the sermons in order to come to worship prepared to 'fight the good fight.'



Long ago William Shakespeare's heroine Juliet stood on her balcony and asked, "Oh, Romeo, Romeo, wherefore are thou, Romeo?" Shakespeare probably was not thinking of Shelby, North Carolina, when a group of men decided to gather each Friday morning for coffee. And these men are not thinking of Juliet but of coffee.



They are part of ROMEO: Retired Old Men Eating Out! Started by Jerry McPherson, aka, The President, this is a time of fellowship and enjoying each other's company. The group ate first at Ken and Mary's Restaurant, then moved to Shelby Café, occupying the longest table in each place. The wait staff almost knew each man by name.



Each one ordered his own meal. Some stopped by for a biscuit, some a full breakfast, and some just a cup of coffee. Some (future retirees) were on their way to work. The numbers ranged from eight to 14 each Friday.

When covid-19 hit in March and restaurants were closed, these men were not to be outdone. They



gathered under the trees on the church grounds at 8:00, each bringing his own breakfast. Jerry Gardner brought a Keurig coffeemaker and set it up on the tailgate of his truck for those who wanted a second cup. Numbers still remained 10 or more. Rain and chilly weather forced the men inside so they now meet in the Hearthside, placing tables at angles for social distancing.

Discussions are varied and plentiful: family . . . gardening . . . sports . . . politics . . . hunting . . . fishing . . . health and doctor appointments . . . prayer concerns . . . church events. You name it, and the ROMEO group discusses it.

Besides all the many topics, the men enjoy hearing Jerry's Stories (McPherson). But the men all say it depends on who is there as to what stories are the best!

All men are welcome! Come when you can, or come every Friday. 8:00am. Bring your own breakfast; coffee provided.

ROMEO: Retired Old Men Eating Out

"Hello, this is a message for Senior Adults of Elizabeth Baptist Church . . ." Seniors are now hearing this message and know it as the new One Call Now, a subscription service for event management.

With COVID-19 impacting church services and fewer times for receiving information, seniors were often searching for ways to stay in touch on sicknesses, deaths, church events, and later possibly weather alerts. This was brought to the attention of the Senior Council that explored all options of getting information out. Pastor Jim Brackett had worked with One Call in another church and recommended exploring this service. All senior members have been entered into the database and will receive a call when there is an official update. The Caller ID will have the church telephone number 704-482-6339 so members will recognize it as an approved caller. If you have not received any calls and would like to receive these message updates, contact Angel in the church office.

When church members know of sickness, health news or event update, they need to contact a member of the Senior Council or Rev Brackett. All One Calls will be authorized by the church staff and will give information known at the time.

Why We Chose “The Gospel Project for Kids” for Our EBC Preschool & Children Ministry

What is The Gospel Project for Kids? The curriculum Children's Ministry has chosen for our Preschool/Children.

Gospel Centered: The Gospel Project for Kids helps the children and leaders identify Jesus' role throughout the narrative of Scripture. This chronological, Christ centered, three-year study immerses our toddlers through our 6th graders in the gospel. The gospel is presented through every story and a call to mission from Genesis to Revelation. Our children are able to see how the Bible fits together to tell one big story: God's plan to rescue and redeem sinners through faith in Jesus Christ.

Kid Friendly: From the beginning of large group time to the activities and crafts for small group time, each Sunday is exciting for the children. The Bible stories are presented in such a way that shows that the Bible is real and fascinating.

Encourages Retention: The resources from The Gospel Project for Kids connects the lesson of the day to the previous weeks. Review questions and connections are made throughout the lessons. The curriculum shows the children how the Bible works together in one big story, and that it is not made up of individual stories.

Technology: The Bible stories are available to watch through videos or told by the teacher using storytelling creative tips. Each story is presented with excellence and creativity. Also, the entire curriculum is available to download.

Teaches the Teachers: Each Sunday the lessons teach our teachers something new or brings back to life a new Biblical truth. Our Sunday School teachers give up being in an adult Sunday School class so being able to learn alongside the children is such a wonderful side effect of teaching The Gospel Project for Kids.

FORT CASWELL

As most of you are aware, last year's summer camps at Caswell were cancelled. By God's grace, we were able to go on to camp and do our own programming and worship. We are very fortunate to have had an amazing group of students with both the talent and the spiritual maturity to pull this off. We are hoping for a return to normal by next summer, and Caswell is hoping for the same. To that end, we have been able to secure reservations for the week of **June 28-July 3, 2021** as our Summer Youth Week. We are very fortunate to get selected because hundreds of churches applied this year since most did not get to attend at all last summer. We also have some more good news! Because we had a surplus left over in our Caswell account from last year, we are able to offer the camp for \$100 less this year. Instead of \$370.00, we are going to be able to go this year for \$270.00 per student. Our initial deposit to Caswell is due on February 1, so we need to begin collecting payments immediately. Parents may pay all at once or in installments. The first payment (deposit) of \$50 will be due on or before **January 15**. Future installments of \$55.00 each will be due on **February 15, March 15, April 15, and May 15**. We will be collecting deposits through the church office and at the Student Center Reception Desk beginning Sunday, December 6. Payments may also be made online. Some families are not yet attending church in person, but I would like to include them in the events for next summer, working under the assumption that we will be back to some degree of normal by then. Please contact David if you would like to be added to any of the trip rosters. Both Caswell and Wilmington sign-up sheets will be posted in the next week or so. I will also post a sheet for Alaska for those who want to be added but were not on the original list from last year.

Another casualty of COVID last summer was the mission trip to Alaska. We have been in contact with the missionary in Alaska, and current plans are to proceed with the trip this summer in the hopes that we will be able to travel freely again by then. We have already tentatively reserved our airline tickets, and the dates for



this trip are **July 18-24**. If you had planned to go last summer and were registered, you are still on the list unless you requested a refund that included your deposit. As long as your deposit is remaining in your account, you may just pick up where you left off last year. We will resume payments for this trip in January 2021. I can take additional people next summer, so if you are interested in going and did not sign up, you may place your name on the list with a \$50.00 deposit. Simply pay through the office (if before January 1), and after that, we will be taking online payments* and payments through the Student Center Reception Desk on Sunday mornings. Total cost (after fund raising) will hopefully be \$750.00.



Come join us each Sunday morning for worship! RIZEN plays for both services in the Christian Life Center, and it is broadcast on Instagram Live. Come celebrate with us! Soon after Christmas, you will get to see and hear their first professionally recorded project, a song and music video, as they prepare to launch a social media ministry to teenagers and young adults all across the United States and beyond.






