“PASSEVER AND NEW LIFE ”

God initiated the feast of Passover in the spring for a reason. Spring is the time of the year when nature experiences renewal and resurrection. Roughly 3,500 years ago, God brought the nation of Israel out of Egypt in the spring of the year. It was not only a time for new life in the natural order, but it was also a time for new life in the spiritual order. God was preparing a people for Himself. Israel would be a people that would bless the world with the coming Messiah. This event was so important that it also brought about a new order in Israel's calendar. Exodus 12:1-2 says, **“Now the LORD spoke to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, saying, ‘This month shall be your beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year to you.’”**

Centuries later, the events of Holy Week would take place in spring. The gospels tell us that Jesus revealed His betrayer while celebrating an early Passover meal with His disciples. John 13:1-2 says, **“Now before the feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that His hour had come that He should depart from this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end. And supper being ended, the devil having already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray Him.”** In the course of Jesus' trials, the Roman governor Pilate sought to release Jesus as it is written in John 18:38-39, **“Pilate... went out again to the Jews, and said to them, ‘I find no fault in Him at all. But you have a custom that I should release someone to you at the Passover. Do you therefore want me to release to you the King of the Jews?’”**

In God's amazing providence, during the day that the Jews were preparing for Passover and killing their lambs, they were also preparing to crucify our Lord. **“Now it was the Preparation Day of the Passover, and about the sixth hour. And he [Pilate] said to the Jews, ‘Behold your King!’ But they cried out, ‘Away with Him, away with Him! Crucify Him!’”** (John 19:14-15). Roughly 2,000 years ago, God redeemed the world in the spring of the year. The sacrificial death of the Lamb of God, the Messiah, was not only a time for new life in the natural order, but it was also a time for new life in the spiritual order. Through the work of the Messiah, God was preparing to save you and me. This spring may God once again do a new thing. May He bring about renewal and revival into our hearts and lives as we serve Him together!

Dear Church Family,

I wish I had a nickel for every person who has said to me in the past 38 years “I can’t sing” or “You don’t want to hear me sing” - or my personal favorite “My teacher in second grade made me stand in the back of the choir and just move my mouth because she said I made a sound like fingernails on a chalkboard!”

The Bible never says, “Let those who can sing, sing” as if it were a spiritual gift—the Bible simply says to “**Sing!**” Over and over we are commanded to sing; sing to the Lord—sing joyfully—and sing a new song. God made you the way you are so apparently He wants to hear you just as he created you!

I have discovered over the past six months (at least on those Sundays when we’ve been allowed to meet for worship) that you are a singing congregation. I can tell how much the Lord means to you by watching you and listening to you praise Him with uplifted voices. In addition, you have been very gracious as I’ve introduced some new songs to our repertoire—songs which have meant a lot to me over the past few years in leading worship. Thank you for being so patient.

So remember—singing is a command from God—not an optional activity—no matter what YOU think you sound like! Isaiah 44:23 says, “**SING, O heavens, for the Lord has done this wondrous thing. Shout for joy, O depths of the earth! Break into SONG ...**”

Edna Overcash has a story to tell. The church's oldest member, Edna celebrated her 100th birthday on March 18. She was born at home in Iredell County in 1921 to Lee and Bessie Martin and grew up with three older sisters and three younger brothers. Edna graduated from Stony Point High School in Iredell County when school had only 11 grades.



Sam Overcash worked at Dan River Cotton Mill in Danville, Virginia, and was visiting relatives in Iredell County when he met Edna. He finally told her they had to get married because he was driving too much back and forth from Danville to Statesville. They married on Christmas Eve in 1940. Edna worked in the mill at Dan River then later as a billing clerk at Snyder's Silk Mill in Taylorsville, North Carolina, before moving to Shelby in 1962. She continued to work some in cotton mills then was employed at Homelite in Gastonia until she retired to take care of her mother who later passed away.

It was then that she learned retired life was not for her so, when she saw an ad in the newspaper that Walmart was coming to Shelby, she applied and worked in the cloth department. She had always loved quilting but as a child was too small to do much at the quilting bee parties except work on the corners of the quilt.

A building was constructed behind her house where she quilted in her free time. Her son even sold some of her quilts on eBay. She worked in the cloth department at Walmart until she was 88, climbing ladders to put up cloth, and no one would have guessed her age.

Edna gave up driving at 96 because of shoulder problems. She comes from a family with longevity. Her mother, grandmother, and grandfather all lived to be almost 100. Her great-great-grandfather was the oldest living survivor of the Civil War from Alexander County.



Edna and Sam had two children Elizabeth (Betty) who lives in Marion and Stephen in Shelby. She has two grandchildren, three great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandchild.

Stephen says as long as he can remember, his mother has gotten up at 5:30 each day and read her Bible for at least one hour. He is sure she has read it through many times over. He says her Bibles are so used they seem to have been shredded.

Edna joined Elizabeth in 2017 when friends invited her to visit. She says she is so thankful to receive the *Elizabethan* and keep up with church news and misses her Sunday School class during this pandemic.



On March 18, family and friends celebrated her 100th birthday with a BBQ meal and potluck.

Stephen says, "She is a kind, loving, and simply sweet Christian lady. I can attest that she has always lived her love for Christ and her Christian faith."



BAND ALL NEXT SUMMER, SO LOTS OF FOLKS NOW WANT TO GO SO THAT THEY CAN BE A PART OF THAT EXPERIENCE. Space is limited, so now is the time so sign up. Cost for the camp this year is \$270.00 per student. We have already begun collecting payments for this trip. This may be paid all at once or in installments. The first payment (deposit) of \$50 was due by January 15, and if you have not paid, please do so immediately. You may pay in the Student Center on Sunday morning, evening, Tuesday evening at "180," or any time that it is open. You may also make deposits/payments directly in the church office, pay online, or bring the money or check to any regularly-scheduled student ministry meeting. Future installments of \$55.00 each were or will be due on February 15, March 15, April 15, and May 15. Students may sign up in the student center.

We are planning to return to Wilmington again this summer for our closer-to-home mission trip. I had considered moving to a new location for this trip, but we were invited back because, for the third year in a row, a hurricane has caused major damage in this area. This past year, it was Isaias. In order to get COVID as far behind us as possible, and because of the late sports schedules with local high schools, we have scheduled this trip for **July 31- August 7**. This date is later than usual, and we hope it will not interfere with school athletics, but with Caswell's dates, and the dates for Savannah, we had no other option other than scheduling back-to-back trips. That would have been quite a challenge. Cost, as of now, is \$100 per person, but final cost will be based upon fund raising efforts this spring. Students may sign up in the Student Center


Savannah, Georgia...This mission trip will replace the one to Alaska and fall within the same week, **July 17-24**. We have not yet determined if we will leave on Saturday or Sunday because the trip details have not been finalized. This is still being negotiated because we have been asked to join Mission Serve for the closing celebration of the Lancaster, SC project on Friday night, and RIZEN has been asked to lead that closing session. This promises to be a phenomenal trip with ministry projects during the day, concerts/worship at night, and a free afternoon and evening with lots of interesting and cool opportunities to experience in this historical city. Cost for this trip is currently \$100/person, but final cost will be determined by spring fund-raising efforts. More will be announced about costs as the details of the itinerary emerge. Students may sign up in the Student Center.



Senior Seminars: Beginning in March and continuing right up to graduation, we will begin working with our seniors who will soon be graduating and moving on into Matrix, our young adult ministry. As part of that transitional process, we conduct a series of four Senior Seminars, once each month in March, April, May, and June, with the series culminating with our Graduate Dinner and Graduate Sunday. During the months of July and August, our seniors will be dually enrolled in our Student Ministry and in Matrix

as they begin to reconnect with the students there and prepare for college, military, or career in the fall. It is a bittersweet time, but life only moves in one direction, and we are excited for all that the future holds for our graduating seniors. How Is Your Walk?

Are you a people watcher? Do you like to sit on a bench at a mall or in a park and just watch people interact with one another? No, I don't mean in a creepy way. I mean just watching their mannerisms and the way they walk. Many young people have a little skip in their step; others seem to walk with a glide or rhythm. As we age, we may slow down in our walk or even limp along as those aches and pains set in. I can relate to the aches and pains. Each of us has a distinct walk. Many times, we can see someone afar and know them by their walk.

The Bible speaks to this idea of walking in a similar way. The world should be able to recognize us as believers or disciples of Jesus by our "walk." Our walk includes our thoughts, our words and our actions.

There are many passages of scripture in the Bible that refer to "walking" as a disciple of Jesus. One such passage this month to focus on is 1 John 2:5-6. *"But whoever keeps His word, truly in him the love of God is perfected. This is how we know we are in Him: the one who says he remains in Him should walk just as He walked."* So, if you want to be seen and known as a disciple of Jesus, these verses tell us these things. **First**, we are to keep His word. Keep it where? In our heart and mind. How do we do that? Read the Word and memorize it. By reading and memorizing scripture our thoughts, our words and our actions will be guided by the love of God. **Second**, we are to remain in Christ. To me this verse teaches us to stay faithful and strong. Once you make a commitment to follow Christ, you are charged to remain in your belief and commitment. You are to walk just as Jesus walked.

To your children, your neighbors or coworkers, you may be the one they are observing to see how you use your words and actions in dealing with life situations. Your walk will identify you. When others look to you, what do they see? Is your walk with Christ crippled and weak, limping along? Or do they see you skipping with joy because you are in His Word and you are remaining faithful in your service to Him?

I encourage you to be faithful in your attendance to worship and also connect to a LifeGroup Bible Study (Sunday School). I can promise you if you do both, your walk will be noticed by others and your personal walk with Christ will grow stronger than you can imagine. If you need help connecting to a LifeGroup, please contact the church office and we will gladly help you connect with a great group of folks who will love you and support you.






Voting Results for Sunday, Feb. 28, 2021


